WHAT IS ENFORCED





Non-Monetary Claims

- → Handing over movable assets
- → Eviction

WHO ENFORCES



Judicial Officer

- → Enforcement
- → Service of documents





Status

- → Public official
- → Independent professional exercising public service functions



Jurisdiction

Competent only on part of territory

- → Luxembourg:
 - 16 judicial officers
- → Diekirch:
 - 3 judicial officers

ENFORCEMENT PROCEDURE



Enforceable title

- → Enforcement order issued on the basis of court/arbitration judgement, sentence, decision and ruling
- → Court order
- → Court judgment/ruling etc.



Handover to judicial officer by creditor



Service by judicial officer / notification by court clerk to debtor



Inquiry into debtor's assets by judicial officer



Enforcement measures by judicial officer

- → Attachment against movable assets/immovable property
- → Attachment on claims against third parties (employer/bank) etc.

HOW MUCH DOES THE PROCESS COST



Fixed fees

> Amount for each deed: 60 €

→ Standard fee per writ: 110-140 €

→ Cost of document service: +/- 120 €

'Vacation' fee

Replaces fixed fees in case of seizures, evictions, statements of facts

→ Amount: 60 €/hour

Cost of enforcement proceedings in

whole: 150 € - 550 €
