



# PACE achievements at a glance



The project PACE “Creating privacy awareness in civil enforcement” examines the intersection of civil enforcement and data protection, aiming to contribute to the effective and coherent application of EU law in civil enforcement procedures. Key activities include the development and delivery of smart, evidence-based training courses for judicial officers from 26 EU Member States and candidate countries (Serbia, North Macedonia, Albania, and Montenegro), as well as the formation of a core group of knowledge multipliers.



The PACE project conducted a Training Needs Assessment to accurately identify the needs of enforcement agents in relation to the GDPR. The TNA included





### Seminars GTPR in the context of the PACE project




